CLARENCE M. BATAN, PhD

is a Filipino sociologist, Professor at the Faculty of Arts and Letters, and Research Associate of the Research Center for Social Sciences and Education (RCSSED) at the University of Santo Tomas (UST), Manila, Philippines. He obtained his *AB in Sociology* from UST; *MA in Sociology* from the University of the Philippines-Diliman; and *PhD in Sociology* from Dalhousie University at Nova Scotia, Canada. His research interests are sociology of childhood and youth, sociology of work and employment,

and qualitative and mixed methods. He was *Vice President for Asia of the Research Committee 34 – Sociology of Youth of the International Sociological Association (2014-2018)*; former *President of the Philippine Sociological Society (2017-2018)*; and a member of the Technical Committee for Sociology of the Philippine Commission of Higher Education (CHED). Clarence's dissertation on "istambays" at Dalhousie University (PhD Sociology, 2010) in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, and his further research trainings at Brown University (Research Fellow, 2012 & Visiting Fellow for International Studies, 2013) at Providence, Rhode Island, USA, generated a novel conceptual and methodological approach to understanding the phenomenon of "waitthood" among Filipinos caught and intertwined along education-employment structural difficulties. At present, Dr. Batan leads a multi-million grant, *The National Catechetical Study (NCS) 2021: Pastoral Action Research and Intervention (PARI) Project* commissioned by the *Catholic Bishops' Conference in the Philippines (CBCP) – Episcopal Commission on Catechesis and Catholic Education (ECCCE)* to understand the state and condition of catechetical ministry in the country.
